Introduction

- Kamigamo Shrine is an important Shinto sanctuary located on the banks of the Kamo River in northern Kyoto.
- First founded in 678, its formal name is Kamo-Wakeikazuchi Shrine (賀茂別雷神社 Kamo-Wakeikazuchi Jinja).
- It is one of the oldest Shinto shrines in Japan and one of seventeen Historic Monuments of Ancient Kyoto designated by the Japanese term 'Kamojinja'. In general, this term refers to Shimogamo and Kamigamo Shrines, the traditionally linked Kamo shrines of Kyoto. The Kamojinja serve to protect Kyoto from malign influences.

Kamigamo Shrine is dedicated to the veneration of Kamo Wake-ikazuchi, the kami of thunder.
